## What it does:

---

Allows you to add the different role that people assigned to the case can have, such a Probation Officer, Guardian ad litem, Attorney, etc. Also allows you to program certain roles to appear on the docket and the CCS.

- **Code** – Choose a code. It can be 1-4 characters.
- **Short description** – The short description can be up to 15 characters
- **Long description** – The long description is what the users see, it can be up to 50 characters long.
- **WitVic (Y/N)** – If Y, then this type of person is a Witness/Victim.
- **Send Notice (Y/N)** – Default “send notice” value applied to case assignments for this role.
- **On Docket (Y/N)** – If Y, then this assignment will show on the court docket.
- **Represents (Y/N)** – If Y, then the represents check box will automatically be checked for this assigned role when a person is assigned to a case using List Assigned Persons.
- **A juvenile (Y/N)** – An indication as to whether or not this code represents someone who is a juvenile.
- **Sort order** – The priority sequence for which names are listed.
- **Issue War (Y/N)** – An indication as to whether or not this role can have a warrant issued for them on a case. (NOTE: If flagged as a witness/victim, they will be available regardless.)
- **On CCS (Y/N)** – An indication as to whether or not this role will show on the CCS.
