

# Can docket entries be backdated (y/n)?

## What it does:

---

Gives you the ability to date a docket or CCS entry any date, including a date in the past.

## Adding the table entry

On the docket entry detail screen, can docket entries be backdated ('y' for yes or 'n' for no)? If the entries can be backdated, the user can enter the date/time of the entry. If not, the system will default to the dcurrent date/time.

If this is N, when you add a docket entry there will be option for a Document date/time.

In Indiana, you are not allowed to backdate docket entries.

If you say Y, you will have the ability to date your docket entry any day you wish.

Tennessee allows backdating docket entries.
