

FF PATTRIB

What it does:

Lists all person attributes for each person tied to the document in various formats.

Used in template:

FF PATTRIB/00 – Person attributes - stack w/name

Lists all person attributes for each personID tied to the document. If the variable ends with a '-', then only at risk attributes will be included.

NOTE: You may start the prompt with the following line(s) to limit the attributes to only the types listed (there can be multiple lines, one for each attribute type to be considered):

type=ATTRIBUTE TYPE

Items will be formatted as follows:

John Smith:
Single family home
Gang activity

FF PATTRIB/01 – Person attributes - string w/name

FF PATTRIB/02 – Person attributes - stack no name
