

# Recidivism extract

## Report Description:

This report will look at case types, requirements, or incidents to provide a list of potential people who may have reoffended.

### Determine recidivism from the end date or the start date?

If you say yes to determine recidivism from end of original item instead of start, the report will search for matching criteria starting at the end date. For example, if you are looking at probation supervision requirements to determine recidivism and choose yes to this question, the report will start searching for another probation supervision requirement that started AFTER the first requirement ended, rather than after the first requirement started.

## The Report:

The report will produce a .csv (excel spreadsheet) file with the data. Column A, B, and C are first, middle, and last names. Column D is DOB.

The report is basically 3 independent sections. It will report on matching cases, then on matching requirements, then on matching incidents, if all three sections are defined in the report settings.

The groupings are for your use. It doesn't matter what the group is called as long as any case type that belongs to that group matches the grouping. You could want to separate informal and formal requirements for example.

In our example, the report is set up to look at JD and JS case types. Our report was run from 1/1/17 to 12/31/17. We also had "determine recidivism starting from the end".

In this example the original case was case 2, which ended on 8/3/17. Case 4 opened after that, on 5/13/18, which was 283 days after case 2 closed. If we had answered No to the question "determine recidivism starting from the end", it would have looked for any cases that opened after the start date which was 4/5/17, so case 3 would have been included.

In this example, the child had a probation requirement - Informal Adjustment that started on 1/3/18 and ended on 2/8/18. Then the child had another probation requirement - Formal Probation which started on 5/9/18, which indicates a potential for having re-offended.

## Incidents:

This report example has incidents defined.

In this situation the child had an arrest incident on 1/5/18 and then again on 7/16/18, which indicates a potential for having re-offended.

## Where the data comes from:

---

If the “[caseTypeGroup](#)” setting is defined in the report settings, the report will look for all matching cases.

- if you answered “determine recidivism from the end” it will look for all cases that ended during the date range,
- If you answered “determined recidivism from start” it will look for all cases that started during the date range.

The report will then look to see if there have been subsequent case(s) in the same case type group.

- Recidivism from end - then start of second case has to be on or after the end of the first case.
- Recidivism from start - then the start of the second case must be after the start of the first case.

If the “[reqTypeGroup](#)” setting is defined in the report settings, the report will look at all requirements that:

- Recidivism from end - ended during the date range.
- Recidivism from start - started during the date range.

The report will then look to see if there have been subsequent requirements in the same requirement type group.

- Recidivism from end - then start of second requirement has to be on or after the end of the first requirement.
- Recidivism from start - then the start of the second requirement must be after the start of the first requirement.

If the “[incTypeGroup](#)” setting is defined in the report settings, the report will look at all incidents during the date range.

The report will then look to see if there have been subsequent incidents in the same incident type group. The second incident has to be after the first incident.

This report is designed to identify potential people who have re-offended. Once you identify they have re-offended, best practice may be to have a case attribute that says the person re-offended. Then you can use the attribute report to pull those youth who have re-offended to get your real recidivism rate.
